The October program, as mentioned at last meeting, will be the nitty gritty on the November Expo and Sale.



Fertilizer - Nitrogen Phosphorus Potassium

From Orchids magazine, March 2007

The three numbers on fertilizer bags or boxes are in the order of N-P-K (nitrogen phosphorus potassium). Please note that the P is in the form of P₂O₅ that contains 43 percent elemental P. Whereas the K is actually K₂O that has 83 percent elemental K. Naturally, a large third number gives you a high proportion of K. Read the label under nitrogen. Manufacturers are required to tell their customers the percentage of each N form: nitrate, ammoniacal N or urea.

If you use the 'full rate' (1 teaspoon per gallon) of the 20-20-20 (20 percent N - 4.3 percent P - 86 percent K), you will be applying about 200 ppm N, 43 ppm P and 166 ppm K.
