Orchid Trivia

Despite the enormous variety found among the approximately 25,000 species and more than 105,000 manmade hybrids, all of the members of the orchid family are related to each other by their flowers. The five main characteristics common to orchid flowers are: 1) zygomorphy; 2) the column; 3) the rostellum; 4) two or more pollinia, and 5) the labellum (lip). This information is from "Ultimate Orchid" by Thomas J. Sheehan; 2001; DK Publishing, Inc., p. 10.

The earliest record we have of the introduction of a tropical orchid

into cultivation is that by Peter Collinson in 1731 who sent a plant of Bletia verecunda to Mr. Wager in England, but no record exists of its survival to flowering. The first orchids which we know to have survived, albeit for only a short time, in cultivation are a Vanilla species possibly Vanilla planifolia and several *Epidendrum* species recorded by Phillip Miller in the second edition of his Dictionary of Gardening (1768). OSGKC Wins Top Honors at SWROGA 2008

O SGKC's exhibit in the SWROGA 2008 show claimed the AOS Show Trophy as well as the Orchid Digest Show Trophy in Rogers, Arkansas. The exhibit also won the trophy for best orchid society floor exhibit less than 50 square feet. Rolfeara Hawaii Stars 'Paradise' owned by Cindy Hobbs won the trophy for best flower in classes 110-116 Cattleya alliance (this group includes Brassavola, Broughtonia, Laelia and Sophronitis species and hybrids). OSGKC members' orchids received a total of 29 ribbons, and several were chosen by the judges to consider for AOS awards. These ribbons and trophies are an impressive accomplishment in a show of this size. There were 50 exhibits and about 850 entries, making this the largest show that OSGKC has competed in for many years. CONGRATU-LATIONS to all the winners on their ribbons listed below!
