Alan Koch, Gold Country Orchids, Sacramento, CA will be with us in person to give his talk: "Orchid Culture 101". Yes, he's coming to KC!!! This is an essential talk to hear if you are growing orchids. Alan is an internationally famous grower and hybridizer of orchids, and will be bringing some of his plants to sell. Alan Koch owns and operates Gold Country Orchids where he specializes in miniature and compact Cattleya's. Alan started growing orchids in 1969 with 3 Cymbidiums given to him by an aunt. While in college he became interested in other orchids and discovered many would grow outdoors in Southern California. He has moved five times as his orchid obsession has led to the need for more growing space. With the last move, he purchased 10 acres of land in Lincoln, California near Sacramento, for his 250,000 orchids. He is recognized as an expert in the Brazilian Cattleya alliance and a trend setter in miniature compact and Cattleya breeding.



Alan has been published in the Orchid Digest, the American Orchid Society magazine, as well as many International Publications. He has also been published in several proceedings of the World Orchid Conference. He is an internationally known speaker. He is a past member of the AOS Judging Committee, and the Research Committee, as well as an Accredited Judge and is Training Coordinator for the California Sierra Nevada Judging Center. Alan also served two terms on the Orchid Digest Executive Committee and 3 terms on the Board of Directors, as well as two terms as a Trustee for the AOS.

# OSGKC Judging

Ribbon judging at our meetings at the Merriam Community Center are not official AOS judging events, but are an introduction to the judging process and a way for members to share and learn more. <u>Any</u> <u>plant you enter, you should have owned and cared for, for at least 3 months (not just bought and</u> <u>brought recently and brought in.</u> Also, bring the same flowers in for judging only once. For example, <u>if you enter a Paph. one month and the next month it is still in bloom, please do NOT enter it again.</u> Seeing orchids in flower is one of the greatest joys of our meetings and we are so happy to be able to do this again. Please bring in your blooming orchids, even if you don't think they are "award quality". You will always learn something by bringing plants in to discuss and share with other members. And, ribbons count for points which build through the year for our year-end award presentation each December.

# For Fun and Learning!!

### Orchid Growing Tidbits (How I Grow It.....)

Some individual genera – December Blue Ribbon Winners and special orchids - How I grow It:



### Phrag. Waunakee Sunset 'Cherry' by Ken Plahn

Light - LED grow light, medium light Water - RO, twice a week Temperature - 70 day, 65 night, 5deg colder in winter Humidity - High 50-70%, with peak during middle of light period Potting Mix - bark, rock, charcoal, large perlite Fertilizer - Ray's K-Lite, ¼ tsp to 1 gal, in water a few times a year.



### Paph. Barbie's Moon by Kristy Charland

This is a very small plant from Deerwood Orchids. It is under my LED grow lights from Botanical LEDs. It's about 6-8" from the light. It's kept at about 78F, and I use clean water, either from our dehumidifier or from Natural Grocers RO. The water refills are now 29 cents a gallon for their club members. I mixed Klite from First Rays into the water every other watering. Usually water twice a week. My grow room stays between 45-55% humidity. It is still in the medium from the vendor, which is fine bark, medium perlite and a few pieces of charcoal.



### Cattleya: C. Hausermann's Holiday 'Christmas' by Ken Plahn

Light - LED grow light, medium light in winter. Under shadecloth outdoors May - Sep.

Water - RO, daily in winter. Tap water and rain May - Sep. Temperature - 65 day/60 night, in winter. Outdoor temps May -Sep.

Humidity - High 50-70%, with peak during middle of light period Potting Mix - Large bark, rock and perlite

Fertilizer - Ray's K-Lite, ¼ tsp to 1 gal water a few times a year.



### Phal. NOID by Nikki McDonald

It grows on my piano in indirect light. It's in regular orchid potting mix. I try to water it once per week with tap water and fertilize it once per month with Miracle Gro Orchid.



### Oncidium Twinkle by Dipti Solanki

It's in bark and sphagnum moss mix. It's stays under lights in winter and in summer outside on my screened patio. Water every week and fertilizer every other week with besgrow fertilizer. Dry out between watering and watering more frequently in summer. Humidity is around 50 % in my house.

Kristy Charland found this idea for a DIY project. Plants are situated so that water can't remain in the crown. It is pictured with Phals. But Kristy says it probably would be great for other genera as well.

For those of you that wanted pictures, here are the pots I made for my phals. Haven't lost any to crown rot this way and they all seem very happy!

45 degree pvc elbow, drain that matches the size of the pvc below, 1" drill but to drill holes and a couple screws to hold the drain part on the bottom. I fill mostly with bark then add a small amount of moss at the top.

The only thing I don't like about the pvc is that is so long but the phals don't seem to mind at all.



### ORCHIDS Magazine - For the Novice Bud Blast and Flower Blighting

Who does not enjoy seeing a jewel orchid with its interesting leaf coloration and venation, or a *Phalaenopsis schilleriana* with its beautiful variegated leaves? The orchid aficionado always enjoys a well-grown plant with unblemished leaves and a good growth habit. While there are some orchids grown for their foliage, the big payoff for our time and trouble is the appearance of long-anticipated flowers. When the floral display is ruined because the buds blast before opening or become blighted after opening, we wonder what we should have done differently.

**NEWLY ACQUIRED PLANTS** Bud blast on plants that have just been brought into your growing area is probably the norm rather than the exception. Think about how your new orchid was uprooted from the cozy greenhouse where its every need was met, jammed into a box or flat, loaded into a truck or airplane, or sat on the shelf at the retail outlet before arriving at your growing area. Every environmental cue an orchid uses to adjust to its environment was confused by its journey. It should not be surprising that these jet-lagged plants drop some or all of their buds.
